Welcome to the April Newsletter.



pril is here! A third of the way through the year already and still lots to do!

The oldest English name for this month is, unsurprisingly, "Eastermonth" which the 8th century churchman, Bede, based up in Jarrow, mentioned in his treatise on the calculation of time (here translated from his Latin original):

"Eosturmonath has a name which is now translated "Paschal month" and which was once called after a goddess of [the Angles] named *Eostre*, in whose honour feasts were celebrated in that month. Now they designate that Paschal season by her name, calling the joys of the new rite by the time -honoured name of the old observance."

It is likely that the name 'Easter' is based on the word 'east' and refers to dawn in the eastern sky—*Eostre* would have been a goddess of the dawn, then. The sense is of a new beginning, a fresh start, and the resurgence of flowers, trees and

wildlife certainly supports this. The next month, May, was called *Primilce* or 'three-milkings' because cows and sheep could be milked three times a day at this time of year. Work in the fields was of course tied very closely to the weather, the season and all the tasks that needed to be done — for crops and for livestock, and preparing for the days and weeks ahead.

As insulated as we are in so many ways from the natural world by modern technology, I am sure most of us still feel a stirring of something primal when we see the first crocus or daffodil of the season. It gives reassurance that life will go on (despite everything the newspapers and television have to say) and it may only take a few more days for things to pick up to the point where lawnmowers may safely be unhoused, shears deployed and garden furniture installed. Happy days!

Boxted Parish Council Report - March 2024

ur March council meeting was attended by our Colchester Council representative, Cllr Tom Rowe.

Our vacant position on the council should be filled over the next few months by either individuals putting themselves forward for election or if no-one comes forward by the more informal appointment called co-option.

April sees the Annual Parish Meeting at 7pm in the Village Hall on Wednesday 10th. We hope to hear from the Boxted against Pylons Campaign, Harpers Caffe and someone who may be able to talk about aspirations for the Royal British Legion site. This is a meeting for residents, and everyone is welcome. It would be lovely to see you.

We have seen the new imposing bus stops appear in the village. It was a surprise to the Parish Council as no consultation or information was provided by the Essex Passenger Transport Infrastructure Team. We did know that the Dedham Road bus stop towards Colchester would be brought up to standard with kerb changes, but the rest of the work was a complete surprise. We have raised our concerns about road safety and have involved our County Councillor.

Residents and the council are again experiencing crime and anti-social behaviour. Smashed sharp items on the field, graffiti, and theft of bicycles. The police are aware and will be increasing patrols in the area.

e are still looking for some volunteers to help review and amend the Boxted Neighbourhood Plan – this is a really important document as it forms part of the legal framework around what can and can't be built or developed in Boxted. We would like to involve residents and hear their views. Our first meeting is on Wed 24th April in the Committee Room of the Hub building. If you want to be involved, then please email Karen on clerk@boxted-pc.gov.uk.

We are also asking Colchester Council to transfer a piece of the greensward along Dedham Rd, towards Cooks Hill to the Council so that we can add some wildlife-promoting plants. Your view on this would be appreciated. Is this something you would support?

BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

issent (the opposing of a prevailing orthodoxy) has a long history. One of the earliest English dissenters was John Wycliffe who was born in 1320. He was a Catholic priest who became disillusioned with the privileges of the clergy. He is best known for translating the Bible into English so that it could be read all literate people and not just by priests. The church felt it was being undermined by his teachings and, after his death in1384, excommunicated him and removed his body from consecrated ground. His work was continued in 15th and 16th centuries by the Lollards.

The most influential dissenter against the Catholic faith, however, was Martin Luther, born in Germany in 1483. A priest himself, he strongly opposed many of the church's practices, especially the buying of indulgences. The pope tried to get him retract his teachings and, when Luther refused, had him excommunicated. The pope's efforts were in vain and Protestantism was born, spreading throughout Europe and ultimately the whole world.

Protestantism, which began as dissent from the Roman Catholic church, soon produced its own dissenters. One was John Calvin (1509-1564) who was based in Geneva. He formulated a system of belief that spread widely in Europe, including England and Scotland. One of

the key tenets of his teaching was a belief in predestination. The Presbyterian church grew from his work.

s the years passed other groups broke away from the Church of England. Baptists, Puritans, Quakers, Methodists, Unitarians and other nonconformist groups became established. They were particularly strong in East Anglia, with many taking their faith with them to the New World when they emigrated, some to make a better life for themselves and others seeking religious freedom.

Churches, chapels and meeting houses built to house these groups are still plentiful today. On e of the best examples locally is the Unitarian Meeting House in the centre of Ipswich. Unitarianism was founded in the 17th century after the passing of the Act of Toleration in 1689. The Meeting House was opened in 1700 and much of the interior remains intact.

The Speaker filled his audience with palpable enthusiasm and good advice for all to 'have a go'. Writing techniques and the value of Creative Writing Courses were emphasised and the mechanics of editing and publishing were discussed. His good humoured encouragement was well received and provided us all with food for thought. One thought I had was to dash down to the nearest book shop.

He rounded off this fascinating talk with a tantalising literary taster which he read from another of his proposed publications.

DARK SKIES FAIR

To commemorate the **International Dark Skies Week 2024** we are holding a **FREE Dark Skies Fair** at **Boxted Village Hall** on **Sunday April 7th** from 3:30pm to
10:00pm. There will be lots of activities for both young and old.

We have a number of speakers lined up to talk about the night skies and the effects of the encroaching light pollution on our beautiful National Landscape. Starting with **Dr Chris Gibson: The Famous Moth Man**. Topics will range from Wildlife and Nature to our own health. We will be having a number of astronomy talks including: recognising the night skies, our solar system, and buying a telescope.

We will also have practical workshops where there will be a number of experts on hand to help you with telescope workshops and one to one advice sessions. *If you want to know something about your equipment then bring it along and we will show you how to use it.*

Weather permitting during the day we will have some Solar Telescopes trained on the Sun where you will be able to see sunspots on the surface, and flares and prominences being ejected into the chromosphere. As the sun sets we celebrate the dark skies—with the moon out of the way you will be
