pring is making an attack on winter with the now lighter mornings and drawn-out evenings, something I always rejoice at as we are in the middle of lambing and it makes it so much easier and cheerier having light.

This year with 103 ewes scanned in lamb we were set for a busy time. It is always a time of waiting and watching, with excitement and anticipation knowing there will be the amazing success stories of lambs being adopted to other mothers and little ones making it against all the odds, but as with all things there are also the sad stories of loss.

Lambing is a time of reflection as we spend more time than usual looking at the sheep and really paying attention to their characters. When the sheep are in the fields I find it difficult to see many distinguishing features between one sheep and the next but when in the barn at lambing time you really get to know them and their individual characters.

Jesus says of Himself that He is the Good Shepherd and that He knows His sheep (John 10:14). God, who created all things and each person and each sheep, knows each one by name. How incredible it is that God knows the intimate details of all that He has created! In Psalm 139 David says:

From Councillor Lewis Barber

recently voted on Essex County Council's (ECC) budget for the upcoming financial year. ECC's revenue budget is approximately £2 billion with a capital programme of about £1 billion. The biggest area of expenditure is on social care, with demand and complexity increasing. This is, inevitability, having an impact on other areas like Highways maintenance. Council tax is proposed to increase by 2.99% with a 2% increase in the social care levy too. Balancing these competing priorities is a challenge, but one I must deal with when I vote.

I was pleased to vote for a £12 million increase in Highways. This includes extra money for maintenance, speed and traffic projects and greater enforcement for issues such as overgrown vegetation and flooding. I know these are some of your Highways priorities and I have been lobbying for more money into these areas. It was good to see such proposals come forward so I could support them. These include a further priority budget for me, so please do let me know of your priorities for Boxted, Langham and elsewhere.

I organised a meeting with the councillor in charge of highways prior

to Christmas to discuss traffic and speed issues in Boxted, Dedham and Langham. The meeting was productive and the councillor listened to our concerns about the traffic report produced. They agreed to revisit this and I am looking forward to a positive breakthrough on these issues. We also organised a meeting with campaigners and other stakeholders on site at Boxted Bridge to discuss repair vs replacement and other associated matters. The councillor in charge, who has only relatively recently started in post, was amicable to our concerns and willing to meet with the campaign group and their experts to discuss next steps.

he winter has been particularly challenging for the road network. with high levels of flooding affecting the usability and condition of many roads. There has also been a significant number of properties directly impacted too. There can be a variety of causes of flooding and I aim to mitigate the impact as best as possible. For example, there is ongoing discussions to find solutions with organisations including the Environment Agency, Anglian Water, Parish Councils, MPs and ECC. If you have a

flooding issue, please do get in touch with myself so we can ensure it is considered in any solutions. If your property is affected by flooding, you can apply for Property Flood Resilience Grant to ECC. You can find details of this online, or you can contact me directly.

I continue to monitor National Highways' timeframes for dealing with Severalls Lane Bridge. The length of time National Highways has taken to resolve this has been frustrating, to say the least. You may recall my previous updates that, from May 2023, it was

envisaged that it would be 12 months until the design was completed and 18 -24 months (from May 2023) until repairs were completed. This is to coincide to be done before the now approved A12 widening scheme takes place but after the current roadworks. I have checked and been assured that the recent delays to the finishing date for the A12 resurfacing will not affect the bridge works.

All the owners are volunteers and are matched to where they would like to work, whether it be care homes, schools, Essex University, play groups and even at Southend airport where they put the nervous passengers at ease. They do not go anywhere other than in Essex. Rescue dogs can be used but they have to have been with their owner 6 months and then they are assessed. After the talk there was question and answer time.

THEY LIVED IN LANGHAM

An occasional series by the Langham Heritage Group

3. SIR LAURENCE PIERCE BROOKE MERRIAM MC, 1894 – 1966

The White House, Dedham Road, 1933-1964

Laurence Pierce Brooke Merriam's grandfather, Levi Parsons Merriam, came from the United States to London, where, in 1875, Daniel Spill and he formed the British Xylonite Company to manufacture celluloid (xylonite) and other newlydeveloped plastics at Hale End, Walthamstow. The company was the first in Britain to mass-produce plastic articles such as brushes, combs and boxes, marketed under the brand-names Halex and Bex. In 1887 land was acquired on the Stour Estuary at Brantham, where plastics of outstanding design were manufactured by British Xylonite (through its subsidiary BX Plastics) until 1966. The products were designed 'in house' at Lawford Place. In 1931 British Xylonite acquired Cascelloid Ltd, a firm producing very popular plastic toys under the brand-name Palitoy. The Scottish Distillers Company acquired BX Plastics in 1961 and five years later the company ceased manufacturing.

An outstanding sportsman, Merriam represented Oxford University at swimming, water polo and rugby. He was commissioned into the Rifle Brigade early in the Great War and was subsequently

posted to the Machine Gun Corps. At the Battle of Flers (1916) he was severely wounded in an action where his courage and leadership earned him the Military Cross; on recovery, he was transferred to the newly-formed Tank Corps. Merriam ended the war as Acting Major.

On demobilisation, Merriam resumed playing top rank rugby, was Captain of Blackheath RFC and was capped twice for England. He rejoined his family's firms, British Xylonite and Halex Ltd, in due course becoming company chairman. In 1921 he married Lady Marjory Kennedy, daughter of the Marquess of Ailsa, and the couple lived at Bluebridge

House, Halstead, before acquiring The White House (formerly The Elms) in 1933. Lady Marjory, with Angela South (Old Mill House) and Jane Harter, later Yeatman, (Church Farm) founded the Langham Women's Institute in 1938.

In the Second World War, Merriam was seconded to the Ministry of Supply, his important contribution to the war effort being recognised by a knighthood. After the war he returned to British Xylonite and its associated companies and served on the national councils of the plastics and furniture industries. He was appointed a member of two hospital boards, a magistrate and Deputy Lieutenant and was elected to the Essex County Council. But he still found time to play tennis and squash: in the 1930s, he had run energetically round Langham in singlet and shorts, more than once being thought a stray from Severalls Hospital. Exuding authority, as chairman of the County

Council's Finance Committee he incurred the enmity of Harwich's representative, who commented that "when Sir Laurence was dubbed it was a pity the sword didn't slip and cut his bloody head off".

The Merriams left The White House in 1964 to live at Loom House, Dedham. Merriam himself died suddenly in 1966, having collapsed when leaving

the train at Liverpool Steet station; Lady Marjory died in 1988.






