## BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

he word "cockney" first appeared in English in1362 in the medieval poem Piers Plowman. It meant "small egg" and was used by country folk as a disparaging term for town dwellers. It applied to all town-dwellers but in time it referred solely to Londoners. It was recognised as a linguistic term in 1890.

So what did you have to be to be a cockney? First of all you had to be born within the sound of Bow bells. This covered a wider area than today when high-rise buildings and traffic noise mask the sound. In 1941 a German bomb destroyed the bells and they weren't restored until 1961 so technically for twenty years no cockneys were born. A second attribute was that you had to be working class and thirdly you needed to speak a dialect.

One of the key characteristics of the dialect that was spoken was rhyming slang, for example "apples and pears" meaning "stairs", "Lady Godiva" meaning "a fiver", "tea leaf" meaning "a thief" and "trouble and strife" meaning "wife". Some of the words and phrases are easy to understand, while others are more obscure, For instance, "barnet" means "hair". "Hair" rhymes with "fair" and is an allusion to a horse fair that used to be held in Barnet in London.

"Scarper" meaning "go" rhymes with "Scarpa Flow" in the Orkneys. "Rabbit" is rhyming slang for "rabbit and pork" and means "talk". Rhyming slang is not much heard in central London today and many speakers of it have moved out of town, often to the east, modifying their language as they did so. The language they speak is often called

"Estuary English".

ockneys worked at many trades but conspicuous among them were those who dressed as Pearly Kings and Queens. These were costermongers and they dressed in distinctive clothing that was decorated with pearly buttons. Some Cockneys became very famous, especially in sport, acting and the world of entertainment. In all, Cockneys have made a considerable contribution to our heritage.

### PROBUS CLUB OF COLCHESTER

ur last meeting on the 12th February was well attended with 20 members, including one new lady member and a guest.

The talk this week was delivered by Roger Smith a volunteer for a number of years for the Essex and Herts, Air Ambulance

The Air Ambulance service in the UK is supported and funded by public donations. Two Lotteries and Charity shops. The service covering Essex and Herts as 400 volunteers that help mainly with fund raising and they need to raise £12 million per year to pay for the maintenance and servicing of two helicopters and 4 motor vehicles. The service was formed in 1997, and in 1998 the first helicopter was purchased.

In addition each helicopter has a pilot and a co pilot, plus a Doctor and a paramedic. Although the Doctors are NHS personnel the air ambulance service has to meet the salary costs of the medical professionals when they are on duty. As far as is known only two donations have been given by Prime Ministers and that money did not come out of normal public funds, but money recovered from financial institutions.

The helicopters are stationed at Earls Colne airfield, a former WW2 facility used by the US Air Force. They operate only in daylight between the hours of 0800 and 1800, but not at night. The area they cover apart from Essex and Herts extends to hospitals in Norwich, Cambridge, Southend and London. This is because the Doctors on board determine which hospital offers the most appropriate medical facilities to meet the needs of the injured patient. In the air the pilot is in charge but once on the ground the on board Doctor is then responsible.

Each helicopter is equipped with as much medical equipment as an A&E department. In January 2025 49 RTA's were attended, 95 medical emergencies, 42 Traumas. Also last year the service attended 93 stabbings.

This was a very interesting talk, detailed with technical information and was well received by those attending illustrated by the number of questions raised.

The January meeting was a very interesting talk by John Cameron who told us about the Medical Detector Dogs. Our Queen is patron to the Medical Detector Dogs charity and the work with the dogs is in collaboration with International Clinicians, Universities and the NHS Trust. It is usually spaniels and labradors that are used as they have special qualities. Some come from breeders and others are donated. It takes 18 months to 2 years to train a dog at a cost of approximately £29,000. These dogs can detect diseases that science cannot. They pick up smells

that are unique to Cancer, Parkinson's, Covid and many other diseases. Detection of scents can be 10miles away. Each of their nostrils detect different smells. Their right side nostril detects smells that they recognise and their left nostril detects new smells. They are amazing dogs and have saved many peoples lives.







### LANGHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

y now, most residents will be aware of Colchester City Council's aspiration to convert Langham from a semi-rural village into a small densely concentrated urban settlement by building 900 new homes in the prime agricultural farmland at the heart of the village.

LPC were first informed of these intentions just two days before the publication, on 6th February, of CCC's draft Local Plan proposals for the whole of the

Colchester area. This came completely out of the blue with no prior consultation at all.

More than 70 residents attended our Parish Council Meeting on 12th February, where it was agreed to set up a "Langham900" email campaign asking all residents to send in their reasoned objections to these proposals for Langham. By the 17th February, 300 emails had already been received by our Parish Clerk, and forwarded on to our Ward and Essex Councillors.





17th February was a key date, because CCC's Local Plan
Committee met that evening to review and take a vote on whether to approve the draft Local Plan and thereby initiate a 6-week period of formal public consultation on it. After more than 4 hours of debate, the Committee voted 6-5 against approving the draft Local Plan. The six objectors wanted to see more evidence of credible and costed plans for the necessary

infrastructure upgrades to underpin the massive housing growth specified within the plan. (sewage, water, roads, schools and GP surgeries all loomed large in the debate leading up to the vote).

The result of this vote is to now introduce a substantial delay in the Local Plan adoption timetable: at least a few weeks, possibly a few months. This thankfully gives us more time to marshal our reasoned objections,

but be under no doubt that Langham remains under grave threat of being transformed beyond recognition.

LPC will lead the fight against these ill-conceived proposals to obliterate and overrun our village, but we will need the full support of villagers to do this. The 300 objection emails are a fantastic start, representing about a third of the village population, but we'd like to hear from the other 500+ residents too. Please visit LPC's website at

then send us your personal
objection email using the
instructions provided there.

We will be hosting a Drop-In Session at the Langham Community Centre on Saturday 8th March, 10am -2pm, to share more information and listen to residents' views and ideas about how best to fight these proposals. We hope to see lots of you there.



In the slightly longer term, we want to organise a full public meeting with the attendance of Colchester Planners. Date to be confirmed.

ne final thought for

now: Colchester City Council faces a huge challenge in meeting the Government's topdown instruction to build 11,000 additional homes between 2026 and 2041. If all Colchester's settlements were to share this load equally according to their current populations, Langham would need to accommodate 55 additional homes, not 900.

### Boxted Parish Council Report - January and February 2025

A reminder that parish council meetings are open to the public. Please do come along and we have agenda time allocated at the beginning of each meeting for residents to raise issues.

he CCTV is working well.
We have cameras covering the entrance and car parks as well as the field. We hope this acts as a deterrent against vandalism, anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping all of which can now be reported to the police with hard evidence.

We weren't successful getting a new committee to organise a **fete** in 2025, so we have postponed the idea of a village fete till 2026.

We have a small **fir tree** planted by the village hall. It is behind a metal fence for now as we would like it to take well in the ground. In two or three years we should be able to use this tree for the annual **Christmas Tree** lights.

After the resignation of the last **phone box library** volunteer, we have reviewed the use of the phone box library with a Facebook survey, and we had more support for an

information point. We have decided that with the nice dry and warm book exchanges in both the Village Hall and Harpers Caffe we would better utilise the phone box space as an **information kiosk.** We welcome ideas on the type of information that we could put on display – just email our clerk, Karen (address at the end of this piece).

Another lovely panto was performed by the **Boxted Drama group** raising funds for the village hall. With these donations we have been able to add stage lighting to our facilities.

We have an agreed **budget** for 2025/26 which sees a 2% increase in the parish amount part of your council tax bills. This budget still allows for some investment with additional play equipment and storage for equipment.

e have seen the proposed sites that will probably be taken forward into the revised Colchester Local Plan. The meeting for Colchester Council to decide all their sites is taking place on 17<sup>th</sup> Feb. The site in Boxted identified for build is adjacent to the Hill Farm estate

along Straight Road and it is suggested that 150 dwellings could be built. The council will publish the information as we know it so, please keep an eye on the Boxted Parish Council Facebook page.

You might have seen the social media talk about the 900 identified in Langham, which seems to pick up the bulk of the Colchester decision not to press forward with plans to develop 'The Wick'. 900 in Langham on top of the 30+ already in the pipeline would be a 4 fold increase from the 300 or so houses in Langham currently and will have implications for Boxted in terms of travel, open spaces and sewage capacity. These are all topics that we will engage with Colchester Council on.

A moan from the parish clerk at those individuals that choose to park

immediately next to no parking signage on the Recreation Ground instead of driving an additional 30 or 40 yards to park on the left side of the overflow parking drive. The signage is in place to protect the cricket outfield from damage. Please park your cars on the allocated parking to the left.

Our next council meeting is Wed 12<sup>th</sup> March at 730pm in the Village Hall.


