BOXTED W.I.

ast month the members were truly entertained by the animated Rev. Emma Barr. Some of you may have already made her acquaintance as she is part of the busy team covering 6 rural parishes. Members discovered her impressive achievements and drive to support the community. Having started with a polluted and derelict farm, she now has a flock of 400 sheep and other animals, alongside she generously takes in charity referrals such as those needing to re-plan their lives such as ex-offenders or agricultural workers finding themselves homeless, this is in addition to her Farm Church and supporting the charity Ladsneeddads.org The group thoroughly enjoyed meeting this most energetic Reverend.

The regular monthly meeting was followed up by a visit to Nayland to hear member **Sue Carbutt** talk of her maternal grandmother **Baroness Catherine Petre** of Ingatestone Hall. She found herself a war widow with children in 1915 after just 2 years of marriage. Catherine took on the restoration of the hall whilst caring for her children and helping the war effort in a variety of ways including starting and chairing the **Essex Federation W.I.** movement. By 1921 it had expanded to



300 members supporting young wives and widows, some with many children. She continued to campaign for rural improvements such as bus services, waste collection and food prices alongside her personal achievements as an artist and master mariner. There is much more to learn of this remarkable woman and Boxted W.I. hope to arrange this during 2025.

Finally and more locally, in fine weather, some members enjoyed lending a hand at the annual harvest of the local vineyard.

He was adopted and was given his adoptive Mothers surname Plumb. His adoptive mother was very poor so he didn't have the privileges that other children had. When he was seven years old he found a letter sent to his adoptive mother regarding her adopting a son. He questioned his mother and found out that the letter was referring to him.

Later in life he decided to try and find out who his birth mother was. It took him years searching to find out who she really was. Eventually he found her and found out that her surname was Friedlander so he changed his name officially from Plumb to Friedlander not liking the surname Plumb.

On December 2nd 1938 his birth mother was one of the first 48 to go on the **Kinder Transport** to Dovercourt. As time went on he found his family grow as he found out about other family members. It was a very interesting talk about all the ups and downs in Tony's life, too much to put in this report.

BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

hurchyards and gravestones are little researched but are rich sources for family and social historians. They have changed their function over the years. Now restful places, in the Middle Ages churchyards were used for fairs and other social gatherings. Some parts of the churchyard were more prestigious than others. The east side was reserved for the clergy, being nearest the altar, the south side was considered the next best and the north side (the dark side) was where paupers and suicides were buried. Some church yards have distinct features. For instance, Rudston in Yorkshire has a huge stone. It was dragged from 70 miles away, Legend has it that it was hurled by the devil who wanted to destroy the church, but he missed.

Yew trees abound in many churchyards, being a symbol of everlasting life. Churchyards have a problem in that they get full. If six people a year get buried in a single churchyard ever a period of 800 years that amounts to just under 50,000 bodies. Action is already being taken: in some places plots are sold for only 25 years of occupation.

On the gravestones themselves changes have been made over the centuries. Classical architecture was much imitated and symbolism was much used. For instance, 'skull and crossbones' were a reminder of mortality. while a broken column suggested a life cut short. The Victorians introduced crosses. In the 18th

century metal cages were constructed over graves to deter bodysnatchers. In areas where there is no local stone wooden headstones were used but these did not last long. Metal was also tried but these deteriorated quickly and became difficult to read.

In the 1850s inscriptions became longer, some being very witty. Others

longer, some being very witty. Others tell a story. In a churchyard in Chelmsford there is the resting place of Joseph Freeman who had been a slave in America but who had escaped to England.

There are no national standards for graves in England. Decisions about what is appropriate are made locally and practices vary widely. Some are very formal and conservative — objections have been made to familiar names, for example, while others are very tolerant of quirkiness, allowing representations of such things as a favourite car. Particularly ostentatious can be those associated with gypsy families who often have their own area in burial grounds.

Boxted Parish Council Report - October 2024

reminder that parish council meetings are open to the public to attend and we have a space at the beginning of the meeting for residents to raise issues. At the October meeting we had Tom Rowe one of our Colchester City (CCC) Councillors talked us through some of the changes that are likely to be implemented across Colchester in order to save money. Some of these will mean changes to waste collection. It's worth keeping an eye on Colchester City messages to see how this will affect you.

We very much still support the Save Our Bridge campaign, and we are trying to persuade Essex County Council (ECC) to stand by their new promise to investigate repairing the bridge before deciding to put in a wide flat longer structure capable of taking 40 tonne traffic. We have also seen the law changed when it comes to protecting what used to be called AONBs but are now termed National Landscapes. The previous Government really strengthened the legal requirement to protect National Landscapes from harm and development and we don't think that ECC have done this yet. It was also interesting to see that the similar plan to replace the small humped-back brick bridge in the centre of Finchingfield adjacent to their village green has now been withdrawn and Essex Highways now plan to repair it instead.

We have installed CCTV at the Boxted Recreation Ground and Village Hall. All outside cameras cover the hall, car parking and the field. Our system is managed under our Information Commissioners Office registration and all GDPR public rights are managed via the parish council. We hope this acts as a deterrent against vandalism, antisocial behaviour and fly-tipping all of which can now be reported to the police with hard evidence.

n a more upbeat note, we now have a sign at the outdoor table tennis table with a QR code linking to local table tennis information.

We are still looking for some volunteers to join a new committee to organise a village fete in 2025. If you could help, then please email Karen on *clerk@boxted-pc.gov.uk_* and I can pass your details to the right person.

PROBUS CLUB OF COLCHESTER

ur members had an informal coffee morning last Wednesday. This was a good opportunity for members to have a good catch up, which we rarely do at normal meetings. Interestingly a couple of questions came up about the origins of PROBUS clubs and who is eligible to join and become a member. So I thought it would be useful to provide a little history of the origins of PROBUS clubs, particularly within the UK.

There are many such clubs in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, United States of America.; also a few in Western Europe. PROBUS clubs within the UK were mainly set up by former members of Rotary. The majority of clubs are for gentlemen. There are some ladies-only clubs and an increasing number of multi-gender clubs.

There is no central body controlling clubs, so each club can set its own rules and constitution. Typically clubs elect a President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Social Secretary, Speaker Finder, Auditors and an Almoner. Our club also as appointed a Publicity Officer. When the COVID lockdown ended many clubs lost members and some clubs ceased to exist. Our Colchester club took the decision to

welcome ladies who wished to join our club. Since then our numbers have crept up and already 30% of our members are ladies.

Our club meets every two weeks at the Colchester Rugby club house. This is a very modern building with a number of meeting rooms, ample parking and disabled access. The location is just off the A12 not far from the Park and Ride. At our meetings we usually have an invited speaker and members enjoy and learn from a variety of interesting talks. Every three or four meetings we have a lunch meeting.






