t the September meeting an enjoyable time was had by members and guests listening to the speaker Katie Cole, her talk being "Three Women of Special Operations Executive "during 2nd World War. SOE was formed in 1940 and was an underground army that waged a secret war in enemy-occupied Europe and Asia. Its agents demonstrated incredible courage and resourcefulness. To be an agent you didn't have to be British but had to speak another language. The first woman Katie spoke about was Nancy Wake who had a five million Franc bounty on her head but still parachuted back into France in 1944 and helped the French Resistance.

Noor-in-Nisa Inajat khan, daughter of an Indian Sufi Leader. She was raised a pacifist but joined S.O.E when they needed fluent French speakers. Her incomplete training led to disaster when she was betrayed to the Gestapo.

Christine Chilver's work was

nothing but rumours until 2016 when her S.O.E record was opened

by the National Archives. Her work helped prove which agents were ready for deployment and which ones were terribly unsuited for spy work.

BOXTEO HISTORY GROUP

entwell Hall is a stately home in Long Melford. It is open to the public and often holds historical re-enactments. For years it suffered from neglect but has now been restored with period furniture.

There is evidence that the site was occupied from very early times. The first reference to it being in the Domesday Book. The present buildings were constructed by the Clopton family who occupied the site from about 1375. The oldest building is the Moat House which is estimated to have been built in the early 15th century. It consists of three rooms on the ground floor that were used as a dairy, a bakery and a brewery. There are also two rooms in the attic. It is possible that this building was designed to be the principal residence before becoming a service wing when the main house was built.

The main house was constructed during the late 15th century by John Clopton and then wings were added in the 1540's by his grandson, the third William Clopton. Finally an extra level was added by his son Francis in the 1560's.

By the early 17th century the Clopton family was in decline and the house passed through many hands. In the 19th century a fire broke out which destroyed much of the central interior including the dining room.

The owner, Robert Hart Logan, commissioned the architect Thomas Hopper to design the renovation. He also made alterations to the library and billiard room. The Hall with its extensive gardens and moat is now owned by Patrick and Judith Phillips who, while opening it to the public, use it as their home.

LANGHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

t's been a while since we provided an update for the Parish Magazine, so here is a summary of what's been happening since the Spring, and a brief look forwards. As ever, we encourage residents to come along to Parish Council meetings to find out more and engage on local issues. Meetings are usually now held on the second Wednesday of each month (7.30pm at the Langham Community Centre).

On 20th April we held a slightly overdue opening event for the extended Children's Play Area. There was a good turnout, the rain held off, and there were many positive comments about how smart the playground was now looking after "bedding in" following the construction work. The £120k extension project was funded through a combination of an Enovert Grant, S106 Developer Contributions from

the Vistry Homes estate, and Parish Council reserves.

The Council welcomed two new Councillors to the team in May & June, with Allistair Hunter and Anna Anderson joining us. Martin Bottwood stepped down as Chairman in May after 3 years in the role and was heartily thanked for all his hard work over that period. He remains on the Council as Vice-Chair. Paul Armstrong was elected new Chairman.

fair bit of time devoted to the contentious Norwich to Tilbury Pylons consultation process, with an organised walk of the full trenching and pylon route through the Parish, which helped us prepare our detailed response to the Statutory Consultation.

Spring and early Summer saw a

In a happier vein, an idea was hatched to trial a Classic Car Show on the Langham Recreation Ground, with the help and support of the Clacton Classic Car Club. This went ahead on Sunday

8 th September and seemed to be very well received, so we will be looking to develop this into a regular annual event, probably scheduled around the end of the School summer holiday period. In the background, we've been monitoring the early stages of CCC's Local Plan Review, which will eventually determine new housing growth targets and locations in the village out to 2041. We are particularly mindful of the ongoing sewerage and drainage problems affecting the village, which need to be resolved before any substantial new housing growth could be accommodated. Our engagement with Anglian Water and the Environment Agency continues, but sadly with little sign of urgency apparent in either organisation.

ooking forwards at two of our near-term future activities:
We plan to hold a Local Plan
Drop-In session at the
Community Centre in the first half of November (exact date tbc) with support from a CCC planning representative, and the opportunity

for residents to discuss what local infrastructure improvements they think are most important to support further housing growth over the coming years.

Also in early November (Saturday 2nd) we will be holding our annual fireworks display on the Recreation Ground. As much as we love hosting this event, it does come with perennial challenges, one of which is finding 30+ volunteers to help run things smoothly on the day. So we're calling out for more helpers please. In return you'll get free entry to the amazing fireworks & amp; a treat or two as a thank you. NEW DARKSKY DISCOVERY CENTRE OPENS AT THORINGTON STREET, SUFFOLK

horington Street DarkSky
Discovery Centre opened
at the Studio opposite
Thorington Hall on August 12th.

Welcomed by a meteor shower and a glimpse of the Aurora Borealis, residents and amateur astronomers viewed the sensational display from the garden of the new Centre. Led by professional astronomers and a local grass roots committee, the DarkSky Campaign has created a hub for the hamlet of Thorington Street and an exciting place for astronomy talks, star gazing and astrophotography.

The Centre, owned by the National Trust, has meeting rooms, parking and a dark garden shielded from car lights by high walls. Leigh Freeman, National Trust General Manager Essex and Suffolk Countryside says "Dark skies are often an overlooked part of our natural world. The night sky has inspired science, religion, philosophy, art and literature that has created our heritage today."



Working in partnership with the Dedham Vale National Landscape, the Campaign promotes astro tourism helping businesses such as hotels and restaurants to attract visitors to the area to witness our dark night skies in winter.

The Campaign aims to make Thorington Street a DarkSky Community recognised by DarkSky International, the US-based charity organising and coordinating anti light pollution projects around the globe. 


